



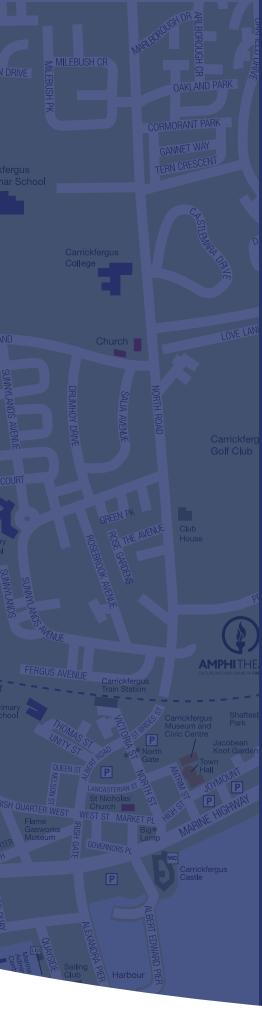

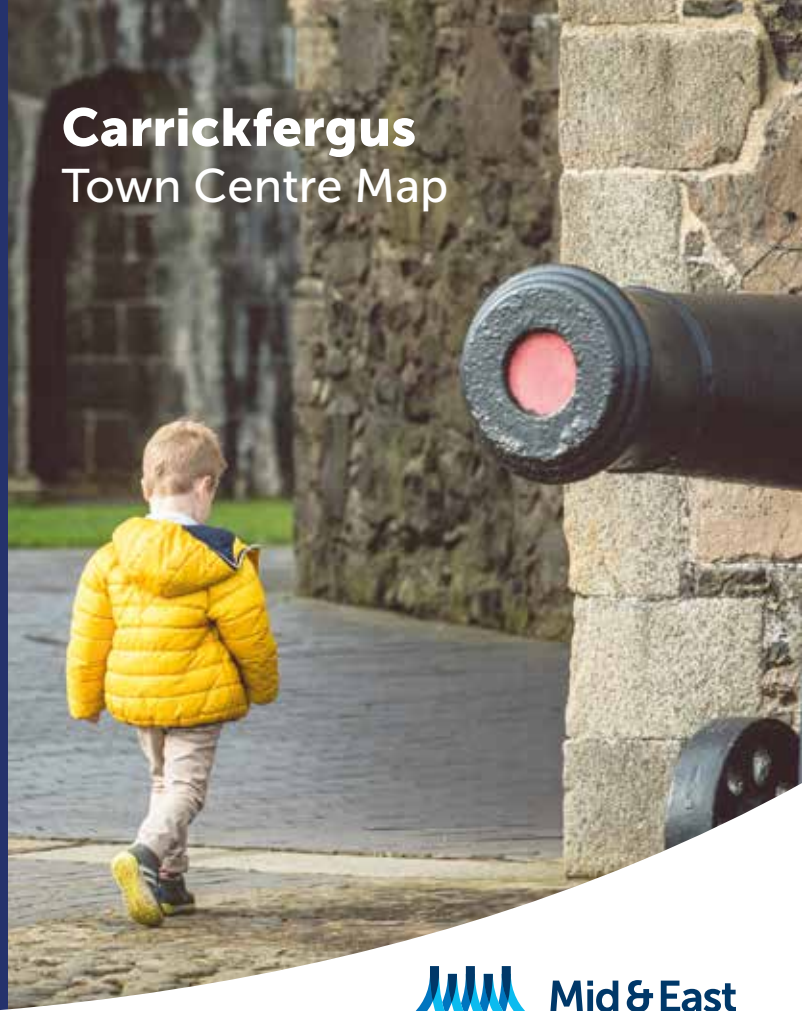

Streets and Landmarks: The map features a complex street network including Regent Avenue, Downshire Road, Victoria Road, North Road, and the A12 Carrickfergus Road.
