Welcome to

The Andrew Jackson Cottage and US Rangers Museum

Everyone feels different when visiting a place for the first time or trying something new. There are different sounds and smells, and you may not know what to expect. This guide will help you get ready for your trip.

It will:

- Tell you how to get to and enter the Andrew Jackson Cottage.
- Introduce you to some of the people who work here.
- Explain how to find your way around.
- Show you some of the things that you can do when you visit.

Here is a member of staff whom you might meet on your visit. He is our Autism Champion. You can ask him (or any of the other staff in this uniform) for help while you are with us. We are here to help.



Getting Here

The Andrew Jackson Cottage and US Rangers Museum is just outside Carrickfergus. It is just off the A2 Larne Road, 1.2miles from Carrick Castle heading towards Larne.

If travelling by car, there is a free car park on-site.

You can also get to the museum by bus, walking the short distance from the bus stop to the museum. If taking the train, get off at Downshire Train Station and then the museum is just a short walk from there.



Arriving Here

Car Park

This is the on-site car park where you can park your car for free whilst you are visiting us.



Noise

There is a train station just a short distance away and the train line runs very close to the cottage. It can be quite noisy when the train passes.




Arriving Here

Main Entrance

This is the entrance that will take you into the Andrew Jackson Cottage. The door is not very tall so you will need to mind your head.

Sometimes there can be other groups already here when you arrive. The cottage was built around 1750 so is very different from a normal building today.

The cottage and museum are both one storey buildings.



There is also an open fire. Sometimes there are cooking displays and it can be noisy and have strong cooking smells.





To the left of the entrance door are two bedrooms set up as they would have been in 1765.








Finding Your Way AroundThe Cottage

Exhibition Gallery

On the right-hand side is an exhibition gallery which tells the story of the Jacksons and Andrew Jackson, the 7th President of the United States, who was born in the nearby area in 1767. The exhibit showcases his life, career, and the strong links between this humble home in Boneybefore and the White House. There is a TV on the wall which has video and sound playing sometimes.






Finding Your Way Around The Cottage

Garden & Picnic Area


If you leave through the back door of the cottage, this will lead you into a garden where there are picnic benches.

This is a museum honouring the elite American Army unit that was first activated in Carrickfergus in 1942.

You will see documents, uniforms, photographs, and other artefacts that show the Rangers training and combat during World War II.
